### How to find it ...

The club is held at the Katolikus Közösségek Háza, Wlassics Gy. u. 84/a. You should take the underground to Kőbánya Kispest and then the no. 82 or 82/A bus to Batthyány utca or, alternatively, take the underground to Határ út and take the no. 52 tram to Szarvas csárda tér from which the venue is within walking distance. Although this English Club operates under the auspices of the Large Family Association (NOE), they temporarily use a room in the local Catholic Parish Hall. The local NOE community has just been given a building as its headquarters, so eventually the English Club will have its own room there.

## 'Grandfathers and Revolutions'

*András Hegedűs was the Prime Minister of Hungary who called in the Soviet troops to quash the Hungarian Revolution in 1956. In 1999, his Australian grandson, Peter Hegedűs returned to Hungary to ask his grandfather about his past, and to try and understand the reasons behind his decisions that helped shape contemporary Europe. "Grandfathers and Revolutions" is the documentary he produced as a result.*

## Changes of Times and Dates

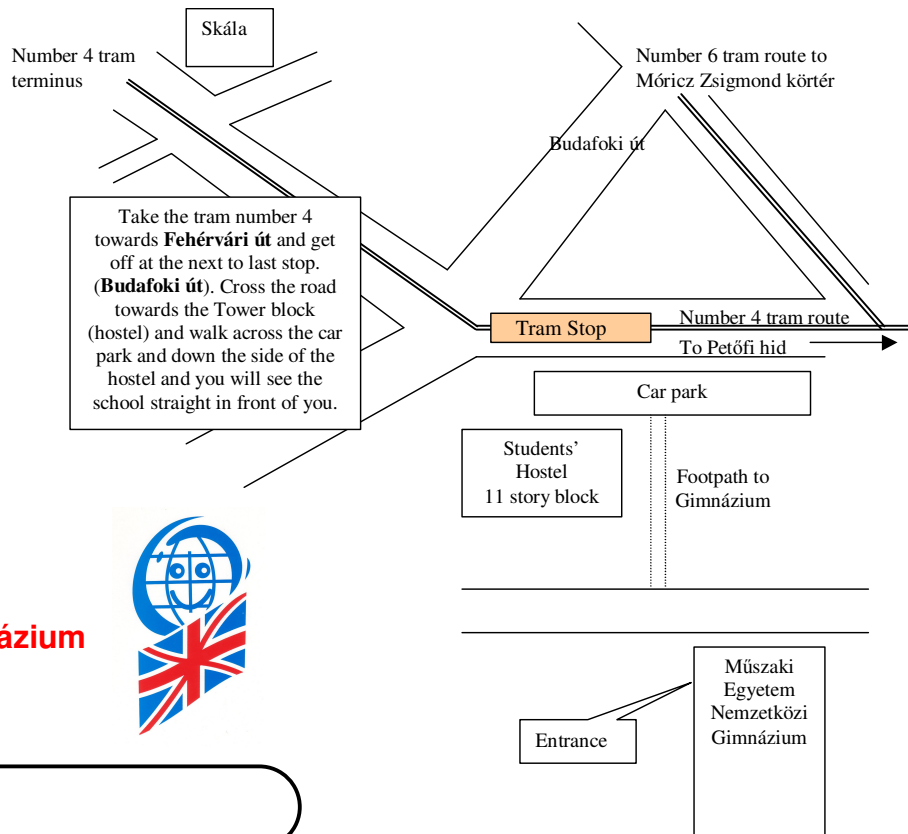
Please note that there are changes in the dates and times of several meetings and that the Singlish Folk at the Hauer will take the spot which had been allocated to the '1956' Film Night.
