Performers welcome

The club will be hosted by Steve Jones, who ran a very successful folk club in Rochdale in the UK for 14 years. Anyone who wishes to perform will be welcome. The format will be informal and there will be no amplification. Instruments should be acoustic only. There will be an opportunity to exchange music and lyrics with the performers and any queries about songs can be made through the Newsletter.

Types of Music?

Although the word 'folk' has been used, this can be interpreted very liberally. Naturally the language should be based on English and there will be lots of songs from Scotland, Ireland and England of course. However, the songs may come from anywhere and there will be songs from Australia, America and elsewhere. Songs should be sung in an appropriate style with acoustic accompaniment. Original material is welcome too.

Poetry, Verse and Stories?

These would be very welcome in these circumstances and we would be happy to see anyone wishing to contribute in this way.

Schools

Naturally, anyone using music in their English teaching in schools will be welcome and we may be able to help by providing recording – or making them on the spot – and providing information and resources in English for your teaching.
