# National Final - Budapest Friday 16<sup>th</sup> April 2004

We plan to have two finals as we did last year. On the 16<sup>th</sup> April there will be a 'B' final (11 am) at the Műszaki Egyetem Gimnázium, where *runners up* from the district competitions will have an opportunity to get into the main 'A' final. Those selected for the 'B' final will also be invited to attend the 'A' final on the afternoon of the same day (16<sup>th</sup> April) at the Embassy even if they do not get into the 'A' final itself.

## Travelling to the UK ...

Students of any nationality may enter the competition, however, the person travelling to the UK to represent Hungary must be Hungarian and will be the highest placed Hungarian finalist. Each area will select one member for the 'A' final and one member for the 'B' final. Local areas or the participants themselves will have to arrange transport and any other costs locally.
