Public Speaking Competition "A Borderless World"

If I want to enter as a competitor ...

You should speak to your teacher and then contact the local organiser in your region. At the moment there are organisers in Budapest, Pécs, Nyiregyháza, Győr, Szeged and Szombathely.

If I am a teacher in a school ...

You should contact your local organiser either directly or through the e-mail address on this newsletter. If there is no representative in your region then you may contact Steve Jones to set up a regional competition of your own.

If I am a regional organiser ...

I need to find a venue for the competition (a room!), judges – three and preferably native speakers but if not they must be near native speakers. Your aim is to have as many contestants as possible but I would advise a maximum of 12, which means the competition may be completed in about two hours. You may wish to get local sponsorship to cover costs locally – prizes and travel to the finals. Please keep all details of sponsorship so that they can be published. If your local government or a school wishes to sponsor their student to go to the UK finals we have no objection, however, the person who wins the National final in Budapest will be the only one eligible to go.

The finals in Budapest ...

National Final - Budapest Friday 16th April 2004

We plan to have two finals as we did last year. The winners of the local competitions will automatically go into the 'A' final at the Embassy. On the 16th April there will be a 'B' final (11 am) at the Műszaki Egyetem Gimnázium, where *runners up* from the district competitions (one from each region) will have an opportunity to get into the main 'A' final. Those selected for the 'B' final will also be invited to attend the 'A' final on the afternoon of the same day (16th April) at the Embassy even if they do not get into the 'A' final itself.

Travelling to the UK ...

Students of any nationality may enter the competition, however, the person travelling to the UK to represent Hungary must be Hungarian and will be the highest placed Hungarian finalist. Local areas or the participants themselves will have to arrange transport and any other costs locally.

Some simple rules for guidance ...

Competitors

- Do not learn your speech work from brief notes
- Remember, you have only 5 minutes (+ or 45 s)
- Be prepared to change what you say
- Practice in front of your class-mates

Regional Organisers

- Organise a quiet room which is not too big
- Organise three judges and decide what each should judge
- Send Steve Jones a list of your participants and the name of the winner and runner up.
