sponsored by Oxford University Press who have also regularly



- The songbooks will be published on the www.singlish.hu website.


What the Foundation does...

The Robert Burns Foundation has raised money for Children's Hospitals and other medical and social charities aimed at children. All of the money raised is donated to our expertly selected charities as all expenses are financed by separate sponsors.

At the present time the Robert Burns International Foundation is working on the following projects:

- Building a new Centre of Excellence of Autism (Central Europe) in Budapest as well as supporting the present Autism Foundation under the leadership of Dr. Anna Balázs
- Working on the creation of two new orphanages in Transylvania under the direction of Fr. Csaba Böjte
- Raising funds, through the Burns Supper at the Corinthia Grand Hotel Royal (for the past three Januarys) which have bought instruments needed by children's hospitals throughout the country
- Supporting cultural events and exchanges in the arts including events such as the New ESU's Burns Supper and the Robert Burns Competition.

The Robert Burns International Foundation has already raised nearly 500,000 Euro for hospitals in Budapest, Nyiregyháza, Ózd, Hatvan, Makó, Jászberény and Kiskunhalás. This year we hope to add many new names to the extensive list as it is the 10th Anniversary Burns Supper.
