Here's all the information you need to participate.

It takes courage to step out in front of a group of people, tell them your story and answer questions from the judges and the audience. In the BBC Entertainment & ESU Public Speaking Awards, Hungary, entrants are required to give a 5 minute speech on one of five proposed topics. That's quite a challenge. This flyer contains the basic information to get you started. Your English teacher can also help and advise you.

Of course, you'll be rewarded for competing. Besides the fame, you and your teacher will also win a prize provided by our principal supporting partner, Magyar Telekom. And above all, don't forget the advantage you'll have over your fellow students when it comes to applying for a job or admission to an international university. Companies and universities are particularly interested in internationally orientated students.



Both native and non-native English speakers are welcome to enter the competition. Don't think that you'll be at a disadvantage if you're a non-native speaker as only a maximum of 15 points out of a possible 100 are awarded to language-related criteria.
